UNITED ACTION AGAINST HUMAN TRAFFICKING



United Action Against Human Trafficking Project is funded by the European Union under the Aid Programme for the Turkish Cypriot community and implemented by the Refugee Rights Association and Step Up Stop Slavery.

Human trafficking poses a serious threat to individuals' freedoms and lives. People coming from vulnerable backgrounds, or fleeing from conflict zones in search of better life standards may be targeted by traffickers.

This project aims to establish a coordinated intervention regarding human trafficking cases and create a systematic communication that will enable support to survivors and have information and statistics exchanges between two communities which will result in a broader bicommunal network among the CSOs in Cyprus. It is aimed to create an impact across joint action for human trafficking survivors' protection and bicommunal advocacy. These activities will lead to an impact through developing strategy, joint press releases, bicommunal meeting notes, and social media visuals.

The project also focuses on raising awareness and preventing human trafficking by providing capacity-building training sessions for students, and educators. In addition, it is aimed to support CSOs with workshops to identify their needs, and with trauma-informed, mindful leadership training sessions.

Finally, art is involved! The project involves theatre plays on the narratives of the survivors and multilingual video production on human trafficking and survivor stories.

Project outputs are as follows:

- Capacity of relevant stakeholders enhanced for identification of human trafficking and providing support to the survivors.
- Bi-communal CSO network on anti-trafficking is established, bicommunal Technical Committees are strengthened to join efforts for anti-trafficking.
- The narratives of the survivors are disseminated throughout Cyprus to raise awareness.
- Vulnerable migrant groups are informed of their rights.
